- **The World's Largest Lesson:** This website is a collection of resources that introduce the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals to students and unites them in action. There is a collection of [activities for children aged 4 to 8](#) and for [children aged 8 to 14](#).
- **Citizen Kid Central:** An online hub containing multimedia tools for children to explore global issues such as children's rights, food security, access to safe and clean water, biodiversity, and access to education and health care.
- **UN Convention on the Rights of the Child in Child-Friendly Language:** This poster can be printed and displayed in your class or home and used as a springboard for discussion on the rights of children around the world.
